Itinerary

9.00am. Arrive at The Fire House for breakfast. Bacon rolls, tea & coffee will be served whilst you are introduced to your host and fellow guns.

10.00am. Once everyone has settled in, been introduced and enjoyed their breakfast, it is time to head to the first drive.

12pm. After two drives traditional elevenses will be served in the field, giving everyone a chance to catch up on the mornings excitement.

12.45pm. Two more drives will be shot, with over 5000 clays being thrown throughout the day.

3pm. Guns will head back to The Fire House to indulge in a well-earned, hearty lunch.

These timings offer just a rough guide to the layout of the day. Private days can be tailored to suit you and your guests.

Frequently Asked Questions

How many cartridges do I need to bring?

We recommend that guests bring 500 light weight fibre wad cartridges (21gram or 24gram) for the day. We can arrange for cartridges to be provided as long as we are notified in advanced.

Can I bring my dog?

Well behaved dogs are welcome at our simulated game days.

What should I wear?

We recommend a smart/casual dress code. Full tweeds are not necessary although very welcome. Smart lightweight trousers or breeks with a shooting vest is appropriate. Ear defenders, safety glasses and hats must be worn whilst on the drives. Any safety equipment that you do not have can be provided.

Can I shoot a simulated game day if I don't own a gun?

Gun hire can be arranged if we are notified in advanced. Any guest without a valid shotgun certificate must be accompanied by a certificate holder at all times.

How experienced do you have to be to shoot simulated game?

Simulated game days are most suitable for experienced shots. It may be possible to provide an in-field instructor to accompany less experienced shooters. Please contact the AGL Team to discuss individual requirements.
