Everything but the birds...

Simulated Game Days in the heart of the Cotswold countryside

Simulated game days are becoming increasingly popular with all types of shooters, from clay busting enthusiasts to avid game shots preparing for the season.

A simulated game day is laid out very much like a traditional driven shoot.

The Atkin Grant & Lang simulated game days start with breakfast at The Fire House, the perfect opportunity for the host to welcome his guests and for the guns to get to know each other. After bacon rolls and coffee it is time to head to the first drive. The guns will spread themselves out and stand at set markers, known as pegs, just like on a game shoot.

Over 1000 clays will be thrown per drive from specially designed clay traps to simulate driven pheasant and partridge.

The shooters are actively encouraged to get stuck in, taking any safe shot... whether it is their 'bird' or their neighbours. It is fast paced, exciting shooting with anywhere up to 500 cartridges per gun being shot in a day. After two drives it is time to break for elevenses. This is also very traditional and is held in the field, giving the guns a good opportunity to indulge in some refreshments and discuss the mornings targets. Two or three more drives will follow before the guns return to The Fire House for a well-deserved lunch.

The AGL simulated game days are set in West Oxfordshire on 4000 acres of the finest Cotswold sporting estate.

Rolling hills and meadows combined with thickets and woodland create the backdrop for the day... classic Cotswold topography that offers both challenging targets and beautiful scenery.

But why have sim days suddenly become so popular?

There are numerous benefits to shooting simulated days, such as the value for money compared to driven game. You can still enjoy the excitement, camaraderie and hospitality but at a fraction of the price. These days are a fantastic way to meet new people from a range of different backgrounds all with a common interest in shooting.

If you are fairly new to the game shooting world then simulated days can be a great introduction. The layout, environment and etiquette are very similar but there is no pressure to shoot your share of the bag as there are more than enough clays for everyone. The targets are testing and will certainly improve your shooting. There is no time to call 'PULL', you simply have to pick your clay and take the shot.

Furthermore, if you are an experienced game shot then simulated days can offer the perfect opportunity to keep your eye in over the summer months.

What makes Atkin Grant & Lang simulated game days different?

Our host and full-time shooting instructor, Julian Watson, has been running simulated game days for over 10 years. His experience and attention to detail ensures that the days run seamlessly, with all the guns thoroughly enjoying their experience. The Atkin Grant & Lang days are run like a true game day with no cages, no visible traps and give you the most realistic game environment we can possibly offer... everything but the birds. Julian works closely with the Head Keeper and a very small, committed team, giving him knowledge of the best drives on the estate. With over 14 dedicated simulated drives to choose from each day offers a unique and personal sporting experience.

Frequently Asked Questions

How many cartridges do I need to bring?

We recommend that guests bring 500 light weight fibre wad cartridges (21gram or 24gram) for the day. We can arrange for cartridges to be provided as long as we are notified in advanced.

Can I bring my dog?

Well behaved dogs are welcome at our simulated game days.

What should I wear?

We recommend a smart/casual dress code. Full tweeds are not necessary although very welcome. Smart lightweight trousers or breeks with a shooting vest is appropriate. Ear defenders, safety glasses and hats must be worn whilst on the drives. Any safety equipment that you do not have can be provided.

Can I shoot a simulated game day if I don't own a gun?

Gun hire can be arranged if we are notified in advanced. Any guest without a valid shotgun certificate must be accompanied by a certificate holder at all times.

How experienced do you have to be to shoot simulated game?

Simulated game days are most suitable for experienced shots. It may be possible to provide an in-field instructor to accompany less experienced shooters. Please contact the AGL Team to discuss individual requirements.

6 years on...

In January 2013 a small team from Francis Lovel & Co and The Oxfordshire Shooting School moved over to Hertfordshire and after three intensive months launched the new Atkin Grant & Lang Shooting Ground. It was no easy task to turn the ground around so quickly, however with a goal to open to the public in April that year we were determined to make it happen. This gave us little time to develop a course that would be worthy of the exceptional ground that was available. The decision was made to keep the development to a limited area and to focus on the quality of the course that we were building. This seems to have set the precedent for how AGL has grown since, with meticulous care to ensure the highest standards instead of rushing ahead and missing important details. At this point we used only a quarter of the ground and opened with 6 sporting stands. Whilst the external ground work was happening renovations were also being made to the shop and the lodge, to ensure that by the time we opened we would have a well-rounded offering for everyone who came to shoot, shop and socialise with us.

We were fortunate to have a great turnout of shooters from the opening and members started signing up at a speed that astounded us. This encouraged further ground development, so we added the high tower and 'Coverhead' grouse butt. Having a range of sporting stands put us in a position to not only be attracting clay shooters, but bringing in game shots alike, and ensuring that the targets that we had on offer were as diverse as they could be.

The ground has been hosting competitions for many years but it wasn't until we started holding



monthly CPSA registered shoots that we came into our element with creative course design. We learnt how to use the ground to its full potential, offering shooters a unique and impressive course every month. When the CPSA contacted us in 2017 to enquire if we would host the English Open English Sporting Championship the following year, we felt like we had achieved a milestone. This immensely proud moment was only surpassed after successfully hosting the event to a high standard that reflected the dedication, commitment and hard work that everyone had put in.

As the shooting ground has developed and the courses have progressed it has remained a top priority to keep Atkin Grant & Lang accessible to everyone. The competitive shooting world continues to grow and it is important that we cater at this level, but clay pigeon shooting is a sport for all and we try our best to make every shooter feel comfortable and welcome. Encouraging young and new shots is a key focus, and we are honoured to have been awarded 'Ground of the Year' two years consecutively by the Ladies Shotgun & Chelsea Bun Club.

If I were asked if the ground has developed the way I anticipated it would back in 2013, it would be impossible to answer. One of my favourite things about AGL is that it has grown and developed naturally over the past six years, the direction that it has taken has been led by the feedback from our loyal members. As it stands, we still have areas to improve and develop, and the whole team are looking forward to working on this over the coming years.

A bit more about FITASC...

The Atkin Grant & Lang team are thrilled to be welcoming a brand-new discipline to the ground. Starting in March we will be hosting a CPSA registered FITASC competition on the third Wednesday of the month.

But what exactly is FITASC?

FITASC is a sporting clay pigeon shooting discipline originally created to replicate live game shooting. It is a very exciting and challenging way of shooting as there is such a large variety of targets and very few restrictions on the competitors shooting movements. Instead of stands and cages, competitors will be stood in a 1m hoop. As with any shooting activity, safe gun handling is of the highest importance.

If you like English Sporting and Sportrap, we think you'll love FITASC. It has similarities to both disciplines as you shoot sporting targets but from several different positions.

Our 50 bird competitions will be shot over two layouts. There will be a minimum of five traps per layout with three different shooting positions. The positions will be marked by a hoop placed on the ground. A squad of six competitors will shoot the sequence of targets from Peg 1 and then move to Peg 2, then Peg 3.

Squads will congregate at the lodge where their caddie will meet them and escort them to the first layout. Once on the stand the squad will be shown the targets they will shoot. The first competitor will shoot all of their singles and will then step back to

allow the next competitor to stand in the hoop. Once everyone has shot their singles, competitor two will shoot the doubles first, and competitor one will shoot last. On the next peg competitor three will shoot first and so on. This means that a different shooter starts each time. Double targets can be simultaneous, on report or following.

On single targets full use of the gun is allowed and on doubles a competitor may shoot both barrels at one target if he/she so chooses. There is no requirement to fire one shot at each target.

Gun position is very important in FITASC as competitors must start 'gun down'. The heel of the stock must be touching the body below a horizontal line, 25cm down from the top of the shoulder. They must stay in this position until the target is visible, and will be penalised if the gun is moved. A line is generally marked on the competitors vest to aid the referee.

The whole team are very excited to be organising these shoots and offering our members and customers something new.

Bookings for our first competition on Wednesday 20th March are now open.

Gun Making; Pursuing Greatness

In these times it's all too easy to forget the impact our little but great nation has had on the world. Our nation's world standing has always been driven through a desire to expand and explore from our small island, and to discover what lies beyond.

With all expansion comes problems, challenges that need to be overcome and solving these efficiently is the key to success.

Engineering, “the science of solving practical problems”, is the area that our little nation, our Great Britain has always excelled and in no stronger field than Gun Making.

Our Gun Makers set the benchmark for the world and perfected both sporting and military gun production.

It's from this rich history and heritage, and pride of our great engineers, that Francis and I started our expansion and quest to build the new Stephen Grant.

The practical problem we needed to solve was clear!

We needed to design and manufacture a totally new British built over and under for the twenty first century.

We set ourselves some base design objectives... It had to be honest, a totally new design, not a copy or action bought from another manufacturer. It had to be worthy of carrying the name Stephen Grant & Sons to continue the legacy of this maker rather than devaluing it by plagiarism or continental outsourcing.

It had to be beautiful, a stand out design with a retro look that conformed to its peers, finished by craftsmen and artisans in the traditional way to the highest standard, without the use of lasers for chequering and engraving.

It had to be authentically British, from design to engineering, components to manufacturing. It had to handle exquisitely, fine and balanced, fitted so as to feel like an extension of the person shooting it.

It had to be affordable yet still exclusive, not a museum piece or overly precious.

And lastly and most importantly it had to be reliable, robust, work when hot, when cold, in the wet, with all cartridges and in all situations in any part of the world.

These were our red lines and we were not going to cross them at any cost. To achieve these objectives and solve these problems we called upon time served professionals and true engineers of the British Gun Making industry, Lee Butler, Don Custerson and longstanding employee of Atkin Grant and Lang Alan Bower.

For the next eighteen months we worked tirelessly together on the design and manufacturing process, never forgetting our design objectives and in March 2016 we were rewarded. The very first Stephen Grant twelve bore Round Action Over and Under, serial number 25013, passed London proof and a dream was realised.

All we needed to do now was to sell them. Priced at £28,000 Inc. vat we launched the new Grant at The Cornbury Park Game Fair. The gun spent three days on the clay line being used constantly in the July heat and proved its reliability to all.

The following year saw the completion of the 20 bore and 16 bore design and with it came more orders! Production was increased as we scaled up to meet demand.

This year will see the launch of a 28 bore on a dedicated action size completing the range and ready to take on the US market.

We are immensely thankful and proud of these amazing engineers called Gun Makers who keep alive knowledge and skills that have been passed down through the generations.

They rarely get the credit they deserve. No one sees their bridges, great railways or ships but their legacy, and that of every Gun Maker from this Great Nation, is built in to our guns.

The Importance of a Strip & Clean Service

Whether you're on the first stand at a CPSA competition or the first drive of your game day, there is nothing more frustrating than your gun failing. Excitement and concentration replaced by annoyance and perhaps a little embarrassment as you pull the trigger and the clay continues to move through the sky unbroken, when instead of a bang you simply hear that soul destroying click. Explaining to your host why you haven't shot any of the fantastic birds that have just been driven over your peg (the best peg of the day no doubt) and asking rather sheepishly if he has a gun you can borrow. Guns are mechanical objects and unfortunately every now and then they do fail, but could this have been prevented?

A strip & clean service is preventative maintenance. It is one of the most important parts of taking care of your gun and ensuring that it will stay in perfect working condition for years to come.

What is a Strip & Clean?

A strip & clean is a type of service that involves the gun being 'stripped' down to all of its individual components. The barrels and woodwork are taken off and the action is stripped down and taken apart. Your gunsmith will then thoroughly clean each individual part and inspect it for damage, wear or faults. The parts will be dried off, polished and lubricated as necessary. The action will then be re-assembled and your gunsmith will turn their attention to the woodwork, checking that the stock doesn't have any hairline cracks than would not be visible when the gun is fully assembled. This is particularly important on side by sides, especially older guns. Once everything has been checked over, the gun will be put back together and test fired.

What are the benefits of a Strip & Clean?

We have our cars regularly serviced to keep them functioning well and it is exactly the same principle for your gun. An annual service will guarantee that your gun continues to work well for longer. Regardless of whether the gun cost a lot of money, has strong sentimental value or is just a pleasure to shoot with, it's piece of mind to know that the mechanics are in good condition.

The main benefit of a strip & clean is that it allows your gunsmith to pick up on minor problems that could, if left, cause a lot of damage. For example, it is quite common for the springs on over and under shotguns to get stuck inside their cavities due to a build up of dirt and rust, which will then lead to the gun failing to fire. Regular maintenance would ensure that the dirt is cleaned away before it becomes a problem. Light corrosion can be cleaned and repaired but if left can cause serious damage and reduce the guns lifespan.

How often you should service your gun depends on a combination of the number of cartridges you put through it and the conditions in which you shoot in. We would recommend booking your gun in for a strip & clean service once a year. If you have had a busy game season and shot a lot of wet days it is definitely advisable to have it looked at by a professional gunsmith once the season has come to an end. We would also recommend having your gun serviced, or at least checked over, before your next season. If your shooting is more clay orientated, we would recommend having a strip & clean before you start a summer of competitions to give you that extra confidence boost that everything is working as it should.




